

The NRT is an independent organization dedicated to strengthening First Nations in BC through capacity building. NRT supports initiatives in the following five areas: Education, Governance Capacity, Language & Culture, Youth & Elders, and Economic Development.

## **Direct Support**

Funding is available to assist First Nations within BC to build capacity via two streams:

Apply by May 17 2018

- · Up to \$25,000 per project for one First Nation
- · Up to \$50,000 per project for groups of three First Nations

# **Ongoing Applications**

#### **Elders Grants**

Grants of up to \$2,000 are available for BC First Nations Elders' groups and organizations, as well as BC First Nations communities representing Elders.

# Youth & Language Youth Grants

Project grants of up to \$2,000 are available for First Nations youth groups and organizations in BC. Priority is given to projects that demonstrate capacity building, leadership or mentorship for BC First Nations youth.

Youth groups may apply for First Nations language revitalization projects which incorporate youth, elders and language revitalization up to \$2,000.

# **Nations Council Funding**

Funding that supports Nations Councils/Tribal Councils in BC with projects that move them to becoming self-determining Nations.





The NRT Foundation is a charitable non-profit society that was created in 2011 by the New Relationship Trust. The NRT Foundation was created to assist Indigenous people in BC separately and collectively to meet their education goals.

#### **Bursaries**

NRT Foundation Bursaries support Indigenous students attending a recognized postsecondary institution. Bursaries are available for Certificate, Diploma, Associate Degrees, and/or Trades at \$2,000 each.

Apply semi-annually by June 7, 2018 October 25, 2018

# **Scholarships**

NRT Foundation Scholarships support First Nations students attending a recognized post-secondary institution, and are available in three categories:

- · Undergraduate @ \$5,000 each
- · Masters @ \$10,000 each
- · Doctorate @ \$20,000 each

#### K-12 Education

Grants of up to \$5,000 per project are available to First Nations communities to deliver Kindergarten to Grade 12 (K-12) projects in:

- · English and Literacy
- · Math
- · Science

Apply by June 12, 2018

## **Nations Council Policy Initiative**

NRT offers funding to support Nation Council and Tribal Councils in BC for policy development within NRT's five strategic areas of focus. Grants of up to \$25,000 per project are available to support policy development and promote information and resource sharing amongst the Nation Council and Tribal Councils.

# **Economic Development Support Team (EDST)**

Now in the fourth year, this pilot project assists First Nations in BC to participate in economic projects within their territories. Support is provided via a resource team of Indigenous business specialists who assist and advise participating First Nations communities as they explore viable business opportunities. Types of support may include developing consultation and accommodation strategies, helping with negotiations and assistance with implementing business deals.

EDST is created in partnership with Western Economic Diversification Canada.
